Bringing all their employees. Planning on hiring more employees once they get here. Over a \$3 million investment into a building that's been vacant for close to a decade in the Hammond's 1st District, the North Hammond section of our city. I think it's a great project. It's the only time we've ever asked for 100% tax abatement. It's the only one I've ever issued as mayor. I don't know if the council, I'd have to ask Clerk Golec if, you know, in his mind if that's ever happened before. But this is unique. We worked hand in hand with ADC on this deal. It helped us close it. But this company was very specific about what they were seeking, and in my opinion, if we didn't give them what they were asking for they would not have chosen Hammond as their business location.
