## BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY MINUTES OF JULY 28, 2022

The regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety convened at 9:03 a.m. on Thursday, July 28, 2022, in the Council Chambers of Hammond City Hall. A roll call was taken: Mr. Margraf – present; Mr. Long – present; Mr. Perez – present.

Motion by Mr. Long to approve the Minutes of the meeting of July 14, 2022 and July 21, 2022; seconded by Mr. Perez. AYES ALL. Motion carried.

Under Bid Opening, Demolitions – 6812 Idaho Ave. (garage), 19-21 Mason St. (garage), 6724 Woodmar (garage), and 6219 Hohman Ave.

Under New Business, Emergency Demolition – 51 Webb (Tree). Mr. Smith advises an emergency quote was received, notice was posted with a 10-day abatement notice. Quote from Brian's Tree Services for \$950, will move forward under the 36-7-9-9 Statute. Motion by Mr. Long to approve; seconded by Mr. Perez. AYES ALL. Motion carried. (Ins. No. 22-472)

Order to Rescind and Release Order to Demolish property at 1317 Michigan Street submitted for approval. Motion by Mr. Long to approve; seconded by Mr. Perez. AYES ALL. Motion carried. (Ins. No. 22-473)

Right of Way Permits (6) submitted for approval from Engineering Department. Motion by Mr. Long to approve; seconded by Mr. Perez. AYES ALL. Motion carried. (Ins. No. 22-474)

Garage Sale Permits submitted for approval. Motion by Mr. Long to approve; seconded by Mr. Perez. AYES ALL. Motion carried. (Ins. No. 22-475)

Under Old Business, 2523 New York Ave. – removable shed request. Mr. Poland does not recommend the approval for the removable shed, based on previous sheds, an 8x10 structure is not removable, it will be a visual impairment with the driveway, so doesn't recommend this right of encroachment. Mr. Pustek has nothing. Motion by Mr. Long to deny the request at 2523 New York Ave.; seconded by Mr. Perez. AYES ALL. Motion carried.

Status - 6547 Madison – Inspector Jordan provides photos and states this is on the demolition list, property owner wants to repair but recommends to move forward with demolition and set status for next week. Motion by Mr. Long to set for status on August 4, 2022; seconded by Mr. Perez. AYES ALL. Motion carried. (Ins. No. 22-476)

Status – stop sign at Hohman and Huehn – Mr. Button states he was provided with the crash reports for the intersection, states there were 19 crashes within the past five years and that is not alarming and none of the crashes occurred during a time when student would be present. Three occurrences were crashes that occurred when a westbound vehicle hit a northbound vehicle that could be attributed to limited sight distance. Mr. Button's opinion is that he doesn't think it warrants stop signs and would like to make improvements with striping, bump outs, marking, etc. and would like to move forward as an interim solution. Mr. Button will prepare a narrative

with the table and a recommendation. Mr. Long states his opinion is no stop sign. Motion by Mr. Long to set for status on August 11, 2022; seconded by Mr. Perez. AYES ALL. Motion carried. (Ins. No. 22-477)

Status - 4905 Linden St. – Mr. Smith states there is significant progress and requests a 60-day status. Motion by Mr. Long to set for status on October 6, 2022; seconded by Mr. Perez. AYES ALL. Motion carried.

Status -1152 Roosevelt St. - This is the property with three (3) parcels and will start the process with demolition. No action needed.

Rental Registration Hearings, 910 Carroll. Motion by Mr. Long to waive the late fee; seconded by Mr. Perez. AYES ALL. Motion carried. (Ins. No. 22-478)

Under Meeting Open to the Public, Councilman Torres states that on the 4900 block of Walnut, vehicles are being broken into at night hours and requests extra patrol. Mr. Long states he will take care of it. Also requesting "children at play" signs at the 4900 block of Walnut. Motion by Mr. Long to forward to Police Department and Public Works; seconded by Mr. Perez. AYES ALL. Motion carried.

Mr. Ed Waters, 5842 S. Erie, concerns with the traffic safety, Erie is one way and people are driving in the wrong direction, requesting "do not enter" signs. There is alley traffic and speeding constantly during school days. Requesting that the pedestrian sign in front of his house be moved or removed. Mr. Button said he will work with Public Works to remove that sign. Additionally, the 5700 and 5800 blocks are the oldest, street needs repair, curbs tore up, old sewer. Mr. Waters would like to know if any renovations plans are in the future for the streets, curbs and sewer. Mr. Button advises there is plans for street lighting, resurfacing and new sidewalks.

There being no further business to come before the Board, motion by Mr. Long to adjourn; seconded by Mr. Perez. The regularly scheduled meeting adjourned at 10:12 a.m.
