Councilman Emerson - Basically, the resident is requesting a zoning from R-1 residential to S-2 Institutional, as it butts up against the land including Optimist Park. The resident wants to install a privacy fence under the S-2 classification but he's prevented from doing that. There are homes on 177<sup>th</sup> Street that are zoned R-1. I drove by and looked at it. It's interesting that the home itself was built in 1890, although it needs some upgrades, the primary issue for the resident is the privacy fence which will be permissible under the zoning classification of R-1. The Planning Commission has give the request a recommendation of favorable and feels the occupation by the petitioner would be beneficial to the overall community.

Dear Council Members:

IC 6-1.1-17-20.3 and 20.4 state that in the event a public library's budget is subject to a binding review and adoption, the Library Board of Trustees must declare a fiscal body at which to present its budget for binding review and adoption. The library has declared the Hammond Common Council as its fiscal body responsible for that binding adoption.

Triggering events that would call for a binding review are:

- if the library's cash balance as of December 31 for all funds derived from tax revenue is greater than one hundred fifty percent (150%) of the library's certified budget for the ensuing year.
- if the library increases the ensuing year's budget more than the growth quotient percentage.

Enclosed you will find a Declaration of Fiscal Body, which has been signed by the president of the Hammond Public Library Board of Trustees. This form must also be signed by you as the fiscal body. Please return the form to us in the enclosed envelope, as we are required to email a signed copy to the state no later than October 1, 2020.

We welcome the opportunity to provide a presentation to address questions regarding this governmental enactment at your next meeting.

# **Declaration of Fiscal Body**

# The Hammond Public Library ("the library")

INSTRUCTIONS: (1) This report must be completed, adopted by the library board and board of the designated fiscal body, and signed by the library board president and president of the designated fiscal body. No later than October 1, 2020, a copy of this completed report must be e-mailed to <a href="StatewideServices@library.IN.gov">StatewideServices@library.IN.gov</a> or physically mailed to: Indiana State Library, 140 N. Senate Ave., Indianapolis, IN 46204-2296, Attn: Statewide Services. The library should keep a copy of the report on file.

(2) In the event the library's taxing territory is modified (ex – expansion/annexation/merger, etc.), a new report must be completed and submitted by the next October 1st following that modification if the modification results in a change to the library's adopting fiscal body.

WHEREAS, library officials typically submit the library's annual budget for <u>nonbinding review</u> by a separate fiscal body pursuant to the provisions of IC 6-1.1-17; and

WHEREAS, under certain conditions designated in IC 6-1.1-17-20.3 and 20.4, the library's budget is subject to binding review and adoption by a separate fiscal body; and

THEREFORE, this report identifies the fiscal body that would do any binding budget adoption in the event such binding adoption is required under the provisions of IC 6-1.1-17-20.3 or 20.4.

In the case of a triggering event under IC 6-1.1-17-20.3 or 20.4 which requires the library to submit its budget to a separate fiscal body for binding budget adoption, the fiscal body that is responsible for that binding adoption is the Hammond City Council.
