MAYOR'S ADDRESS

Chief of Staff, Scott Miller- Good Evening, Council, President Woerpel. Some announcements and updates over the last couple of weeks. We had a great turnout for 219 day this past Saturday. We had a Vegas theme. We had a Sinatra singer. I was there and saw several of you there. Just the overall mood was great. We had a really good time. A lot of positive comments online, on social media as well. We also this past weekend hosted our first competitive pickleball tournament at the Jean Shepherd Center. Picklemania 2025. It had a \$20,000 prize money. Half was sponsored by 219 Pickleball, the other half was sponsored by the Southshore Visitor Convention Bureau. We drew people in from Texas. We even had a team where one of the players was from Paris, France. The compliments we received about the Jean were all really positive. I stopped by a couple times over the weekend, and it was packed. They're already planning bigger and better for next year. The Gaming Advisory applications were all due on Friday. We had a flurry of people stopping by the office on Friday to drop them off. That has now concluded. We're gonna take a few weeks to get ourselves organized and then those meetings will begin in March. An update on our YMCA member discount, I had a meeting with Jay Buckmaster, the CEO of the area YMCA's and we are gonna be able to offer a discount to Hammond Employees. We have a follow up this week. So probably by the next time you guys meet, that will be finalized and we'll be able to offer a discount to the YMCA for all City of Hammond Employees as a nice extra perk and to acknowledge your significant contribution to that project. The City of Hammond ended up putting over 15 million dollars into the YMCA project. I'm happy to do that. We'll actually have the best rate of any organization due to the fact that we contributed. Mayor's getting close to announcing the Festival of the Lakes lineup. We've been meeting every other week at this point and planning activities. We have majority of the acts locked in and we'll be getting close to announcing acts, sooner than later. Some of you noticed, I know that Councilman Tyler reached out, that Memorial Park Development started this past week. We're working on the infrastructure there and are moving forward. Of course, you have in front of you tonight, a zoning change to approve on that development as well. Another property that has got a lot of interest, we put up a sign just north of 18th Street Brewery on that grass lot where they used to park, and that's 500 Fayette. We've had quite a bit of interest of people calling on that property. We have some people that, what we're looking for is, mixed use residential, where we have businesses on the first floor, and residential on the 2nd and 3rd floor. We've already had some developers call us with some ideas to do just that. I got to tour the new Fire Station #2 with Chief

Chief of Staff, Scott Miller- Bernie and our Engineer, Dean Button last week. It should be completed this Friday with the punch list items and then we'll have an open house for all to come out and see it. It looks fantastic in there. It really is gonna be a nice addition to the North Hammond/Robertsdale area. I attended the Lakeshore Chamber Annual Dinner. A few of you were there with me, and got to introduce some of the award winners for Hammond businesses on behalf of the Mayor. This year was hosted up at the Horshoe Casino. A big turnout from the City. We had 4 tables worth of City people who came out to support. Good to see everybody there. Update on 3 141st property, which I know a lot of our residents have had concerns about, how that property is moving forward, the Mayor, myself, and the team, met with the proprietor of the business and the owner to develop a plan to move forward, and I did get to see some renderings of what it's going to look like, and it really does look nice. I think the end result, people are going to be please with. I just think they weren't equipped to deal with a city who is on top of things. They did a lot of work in Chicago before, and they're just not used to the level of oversight that Hammond provides to make sure our projects are done safely and according to environmental standards, but they got the message. It was a productive meeting. We developed a timeline of things to get done, and I do think that project's gonna move forward and ultimately, finally get some resolution to that property. Lastly I wanna bring up that we had a meeting on parade safety protocols. We are introducing a new process that, prior to coming to BOPW for parade requests, and these are the parades that are not run by the city, like our St. Paddy's Day parade for example. The person responsible for the parade is gonna meet with the Hammond Police, and they're going to go over parade safety considerations, just so we can do everything we can to make sure parades are as safe as possible. In case of the St. Paddy's Day parade, the route is gonna be trimmed a little bit, just again, for safety considerations more than anything else. Just 2 more announcements, and then I'll take my seat. We have Mayor's Night Out coming up, March 12th. It's going to be at HAST for the 2nd District. Then we have Mayor's State of the City, which is put on with the Lakeshore Chamber of Commerce and that is March 5th, at the Dynasty, at 11 o'clock. That concludes my reports. Thank you. Any questions?

Council President Woerpel- I just have a comment about that pickleball tournament. I went there and watched a lot of it. I'm impressed by the amount of people. What really impressed me is how many out of towners say that finding a place like that is rare and it's one of the best they've played in. I know I sent you this earlier, but as far as the pond goes out there, we actually had 2 state records caught this year at Dowling Park Pond. One of them was a 13 inch Brook Trout and another one was a 13 inch Tilapia. That's, I believe 3 years in a row for the Tilapia out there, so. I just put that in there, and by the way I have seen some Bald Eagles floating around out there too.

Chief of Staff, Scott Miller- Yeah, when we had the employee Olympics, a couple weekends ago, there was a bald eagle flying around back there that day, so very cool.

Councilman Tyler- Thanks for the report, I just have a couple questions for you. One, connected to Memorial Park, residents were saying that some of their fences were torn down. Do you know anything?

Chief of Staff, Scott Miller- I don't have a comment on that right now, but I'll take a note of it and I'll get back to you.

Councilman Tyler- People were just wondering if they were gonna be put back up or if it's, I don't know in terms of location of the fence, maybe was on park property, maybe it wasn't so, I don't know. So if you could find out, that would be great. Thank you.

Chief of Staff, Scott Miller- I'd be happy to.

Councilman Tyler- My other question is, this 2024 year in review, is this public? Or is this just for the Council? From the Parks Department.

Chief of Staff, Scott Miller- I believe that is a public document. I don't know if it's on their website just yet. Is the nature of your inquiry of how we're getting it out there?

Councilman Tyler- I was just wondering because there's a lot of good information in here and I know people always ask about different parks that are going to be renovated, and there's a lot of information in here that I feel like the public would want to know. So I was just wondering how we're gonna advertise it.

Chief of Staff, Scott Miller- I'll check with our Park Leader, Jim Taillon, and I'll get back to you on both.

Councilman Kalwinski- Chief of Staff, good to see you. If you have a few minutes during the course of the week, I'd like to catch up with you about 3 141st.
