An Ordinance fixing the SALARIES AND WAGES of all Policemen and Firemen of the City of Hammond, Indiana, other than those fixed by statute or by Ordinance heretofore enacted, and fixing the effective date thereof.

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAMMOND, INDIANA:

SECTION ONE: For the calendar year 2017 the salary schedule for Police Officers and Firefighters of the City of Hammond, Indiana shall be fixed as follows:

SECTION TWO: The salaries authorized in this ordinance are the compensation to be paid to any Police Officer or Firefighter of the City of Hammond unless otherwise authorized by law or ordinance.

SECTION THREE: This Ordinance shall have no applicability to elected officials of the City of Hammond.
SECTION FOUR: If any part, parts, section, sections, provision, clause or portions of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or constitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of this Ordinance as a whole or of any other part, section, sections, provision, clause or portion of this Ordinance.

SECTION FIVE: For 2017, the pay date shall be every other Friday commencing on January 13th, 2017, for a total of 26 paydays.

SECTION SIX: Overtime, holiday pay, specialty pay, shift differential, clothing allowance, pension pay, and acting pay shall be paid in accordance and as defined by the Hammond Personnel Policy Ordinance and Indiana Code.

SECTION SEVEN: The City shall pay a residency bonus in the amount of $\$ 2,400.00$ annually to each police officer and firefighter who is a City of Hammond homeowner and resides in said home or resides in a rental property within the corporate city limits of Hammond.
